Ancient Greece: Home Learning Tasks for the Autumn Term

Select one homework task each week and hand it in or share it on Monday.

(You must choose at least two writing tasks over the course of the term)

...for a series on myths and legends. It could be from a myth we've read at school or it could be for a different myth. You can use Mr Jones' template if you would like to.

**Visit 'Elgin's Marbles' at the British
Museum**

Take some photos and write a little about the sculptures and what they mean.

**Write a diary entry as if you were an
Athenian or a Spartan child**

What was life like for Athenian children compared to Spartan children? What was school like in Ancient Athens?

Produce a model of a Greek building

Using a shoebox, recreate a Greek building of your choice. Research the different architecture beforehand then include some labels for information.

**Create a timeline about key events that
happened in Ancient Greece**

Research key events that happened in Ancient Greece and draw them on a timeline. Add labels.

**Write a short fact file about a famous
ancient Greek**

...and present your findings as a poster or a leaflet. The Greeks were famous for their clever thinking and we still remember and use many of their ideas today. Examples are Pythagoras, Aristotle, Hippocrates, Plato, Socrates, Homer etc.

Make a replica of a Greek pot or plate.

You could draw or paint it onto a cardboard plate or bowl. Or, even better, make one out of clay or another moulding material.

Invent your own Greek Monster

You could draw or paint it. Think about which animal parts will feature prominently in your monster and draw those carefully.

Visit your Local library

Choose some interesting books related to ancient Greece. Then research and present on a subject of your choosing.

Research the Ancient Olympic Games

Why did the Greeks hold the Olympic Games? Which events took place in the Olympic Games and who took part? What are the main similarities and differences between the Olympic Games then and now? What else can you find out? You could present your work as a small, A4 sized poster of a leaflet.

Follow a Greek Recipe

Research and follow a Greek recipe and take pictures of your creation. Put these pictures together and write a short explanation.
