- •Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and knows which letters represent some of them.
- •Uses vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experiences of books.

- •Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning, representing some sounds correctly and in sequence.
- ·Hears and says the initial sound in words.

Communication and Language

Mathematics

- •Counts an irregular arrangement of up to 15 objects.
- •Estimates how many objects they can see and check by counting them. Use the hundred square to identify numbers chosen.
- •Beginning to use mathematical names for 'solid' 3D shapes and 'flat' 2D shapes, and mathematical terms to describe shapes.
- ·Selects a particular named shape.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Forms positive relationships with adults and children.
- Is able to play co-operatively, taking turns with others.
- Confident to speak to others about own interests and opinions and listen to the ideas of others.
- ·Confident to try new activities.
