DRAW

An Anglo-Saxon warrior

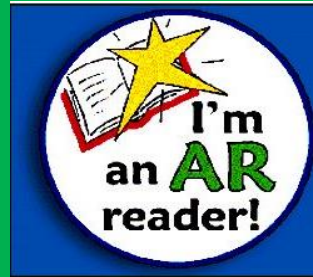
Try to include details such as: chain mail, helmet, sword, shield and possibly a lucky charm.

WRITE

An Anglo-Saxon story

Imagine you are an Anglo-Saxon farmer turned warrior. You arrive in Britain in a boat and instantly fell in love with the beautiful land and instead of going back home you are planning to bring the rest of your family here.

Newspaper Report

Write a newspaper report about Anglo-Saxons settling in Britain in great numbers after defeating Scots and Picts. Remember to include features of a newspaper report we have learned last term.

MAKE

A model of an Anglo-Saxon boat

Research what it looked like and then make a model using easily accessible materials like card board, sticks or maybe paper mache.
