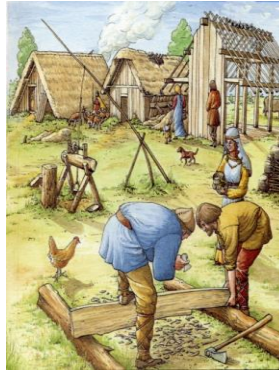


## Year 4
